Covid

Current covid restrictions are in play until 19th July. Lateral testing will continue over the Summer holidays. Lateral tests have been sent with all pupils on Friday 16th July. If you have not received these please contact the school.

If you have your child has tested positive for COVID in the past 3 months do not use the lateral test as it may give a false result.

Reminder: if anyone in the household tests positive on a lateral flow test, the entire household must isolate until a PCR test has been undertaken which results in a negative result.

Currently, the school will continue to carry out internal track and trace following a positive case - this will be carried out by the NHS track and Trace until the end of Summer term.

Face coverings will continue to be used until the end of Summer term.

Pupils will be offered testing onsite in September before they return- training day and the first day in school. Testing is voluntary and cannot be forced.

Duke Of Edinburgh

The Outdoor Education department have recently led three successful Duke Of Edinburgh expeditions. The expeditions are the culmination of hard work for students undertaking the program and rely on students being able to be self-reliant for the duration of the trip.
