## **SCHOOL CLOSURE**

Due to urgent and essential repair work that is required to one of the buildings on site, the school <u>will be</u> closed to pupils on Friday 17th December 2021.

## **RETURN TO SCHOOL**

We have had to make some changes to our start of term arrangements for January 2022. These are in response to the Department for Education's recent request that all secondary school students receive two negative lateral flow tests for Covid-19 when returning to school in January (3-5 days apart). The tests are voluntary, however we strongly recommend families continue to support testing to prevent disruption once students return. All students will be tested unless you decide to opt out- this can be done by contacting the school before your child's planned return date.

To accommodate the testing programme in school, and allow staff to carry out their usual start of term duties, we will need to operate a staggered start to the term where certain year groups come into school for their lateral flow tests and return to education on specific days. The year groups will return to school as follows:

- Year 7 and Year 8 Wednesday 5<sup>th</sup> January
- Year 9 and Year 10 Thursday 6th January
- Year 11 Friday 7th January

If a student receives a positive lateral test result in school the parent/carer will be notified by telephone straight away. If your child's test is negative, you will not be notified. Positive cases will then need to take a 'PCR test' (similar to those done in local and regional testing sites) on the same day (or as soon as possible). School can provide these PCR test kits to perform at home or you can go to <a href="www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test">www.gov.uk/get-coronavirus-test</a> or call 119 to book a test. If you order a PCR test yourself, you should choose to visit a drive-through test site if possible, as it is faster than requesting a home test.

Whilst students are waiting for the PCR result (via text / email) they will need to self-isolate. If the PCR test returns a positive result they will have to self-isolate following the guidance from NHS Test and Trace.
