

SMSC

The SMSC curriculum, is created in conjunction with ‘Thoughtbox’ scheme of work. These lesson topics change every term and are differentiated for each Key Stage. Class tutors then differentiate the lesson to their own class group. The curriculum given to class tutors is only a small part of the overall SMSC curriculum within school. SMSC expands outwards into all areas of the school and is an integral part of engaging our students with their learning and with their local area. The teaching of SMSC is an organic process; given a more formal platform in addition to being part of a constant dialogue between staff and students. While much of this is not presentable in terms of data, the school does keep information on student development in this area via PSP logs, updated termly.
