Martyn's Law



Our school is preparing for the introduction of Martyn's Law, the new UK legislation designed to improve the safety of the public within organisations. As part of this, we will be implementing a policy and practising safety drills with staff and students.

What this means for parents:

We will be introducing a Martyn's Law Safety Policy to strengthen our emergency preparedness.

In the new year, students and staff will take part in practice drills to ensure everyone knows what to do in the unlikely event of an incident.

- Clear age-appropriate explanations will be given to students before any drill takes place.
- You will receive letters and updates with further details, and what to expect.
- Our priority continues to be creating a safe, calm, and reassuring environment for all children.

Why are we doing this?

Martyn's Law aims to ensure all organisations with public access have simple and effective plans in place to keep people safe. By preparing calmly and sensibly, we help build confidence, raise awareness, and ensure our community is protected.

What happens next?

A letter will be sent to all parents outlining our implementation timeline and providing additional guidance. Thank you for your support as we continue to prioritise safety within our school community.
